1 The application

- 1.1 Qantas applied to the Commission on 17 November 2008 to revoke, pursuant to section 27AA of the *International Air Services Commission Act 1992* (the Act), Determinations [2005] IASC 106, [2005] IASC 123, [2005] IASC 124, [2005] IASC 126, [2006] IASC 103 and [2006] IASC 113 which together allocate thirteen B767-200 units on the Japan route under the Australia Japan air services arrangements. The Qantas group has decided to substantially reduce its services on the Japan route and has accordingly sought a reduction in its capacity allocation on the route.
- 1.2 Material supplied by the applicant is filed on the Register of Public Documents.

2 Commission's consideration

2.1 If an Australian carrier asks the Commission to revoke a determination, the Commission must make a decision revoking the determination (section 27AA (3) of the Act).

3 Decision ([2008] IASC 220)

3.1 In accordance with section 27AA of the Act, the Commission revokes Determinations [2005] IASC 106, [2005] IASC 123, [2005] IASC 124, [2005] IASC 126, [2006] IASC 103 and [2006] IASC 113.
