Submission in response to draft decision [2012] IASC 106d

It is disappointing that the IASC, at the first hint of legal challenge, have failed to uphold the courage of its convictions and enforce the termination of the code share arrangement between Qantas and South African Airways as previously decided in 2011. The IASC have failed in its mandate to act in the best interest of the public and as a result the public will be subject to an unfair monopolistic arrangement that will cost them millions of dollars over the at least the next two years and probably longer.

I feel that having failed in their duty to act in the best interests of the public the Board of the IASC should resign and request that the Minister appoint a Board that is better suited to the interest and expectations of the public.
