RE: RENEWAL OF DETERMINATIONS – VARIOUS ROUTES

Qantas Airways Limited (**Qantas**) wishes to renew the determinations allocating capacity to Qantas on various routes which expire in June and July 2027.

Indonesia route - Determination [2021] IASC 107

Qantas seeks to renew Determination [2021] IASC 107, which allocates 100 seats per week in each direction of passenger capacity on the Indonesia route. The determination is due to expire on 25 June 2027.

Qantas and Jetstar continue to operate services between Australia and Indonesia. Qantas requests that Determination [2021] IASC 107 be renewed for a further five-year period and that all existing conditions in the determination be retained. The capacity may be utilised by Qantas or its wholly-owned subsidiary, Jetstar Airways Pty Limited (**Jetstar**). Qantas may use the capacity to provide joint services with any wholly-owned subsidiary of the Qantas Group, and the capacity may be used by any wholly-owned subsidiary of the Qantas Group to provide joint services with Qantas. Jetstar is permitted to offer codeshare services with Emirates and KLM Royal Dutch Airlines in accordance with the codeshare agreements dated 11 February 2014 and 17 December 2019 respectively.

Papua New Guinea route - Determination [2021] IASC 109

Qantas seeks to renew Determination [2021] IASC 109, which allocates 1,000 seats of passenger capacity per week in each direction on the Papua New Guinea route. The determination is due to expire on 30 June 2027.

Qantas continues to operate services from Brisbane and Sydney to Port Moresby. Qantas requests that Determination [2021] IASC 109 be renewed for a further five-year period and that all existing conditions in the determination be retained. The capacity may be utilised by Qantas or Jetstar.



South Africa route - Determination [2022] IASC 114

Qantas seeks to renew Determination [2022] IASC 114, which allocates three frequencies of passenger capacity per week on the South Africa route. The determination expires on 21 July 2027.

Qantas continues to operate services three times per week between Perth and Johannesburg. Qantas requests that Determination [2022] IASC 114 be renewed for a further five-year period and that all existing conditions be retained.

IASC Act and Policy Statement considerations

We request that this application be considered against the 'reasonable capability criterion' as defined in section 8 of the Minister's Policy Statement. Qantas and Jetstar continue to hold the licences, permits and relevant approvals required to operate on and service the relevant routes.

We would be pleased to provide any further information the Commission requires.
