AN APPLICATION OF DETERMINATIONS

AERgo International Australia Pty Ltd (ACN 110 218 016) respectfully sort allocation request of the following freight capacity allocation on each of the following route determinations.

Papua New Guinea - Determination

AERgo request three (3) cargo freighter services in each direction for an allocation of 45 tonnes per week of the available 77 tonnes on this route. AERgo will look to start one (1) service per week with the intention to grow the service in full capacity within the Northern Summer of 2023.

We seek allocation for a period of 3 years commencing 07 November 2022 with full capacity utilisation by 3 June 2023.

Vanuatu - Determination

AERgo request one (1) cargo freighter service in each direction per week of unrestricted capacity that is available for this route.

We seek allocation for a period of 3 years commencing 07 November with full unrestricted capacity utilisation by 14 November 2022.

AERgO International will be wet leasing aircraft from an Australian AOC airline holder with high-capacity aircraft approvals operating cargo freighter aircrafts to the requested destinations. We expect to receive the designation approvals by 30 September 2022, which will allow AERgO International to commence the advised services.

Aircraft Type and Competition


AERgO International will operate B737-300F freighter aircraft which is suited to Papua New Guinea and Vanuatu routes with payloads of up to 15,000kg each sector. AERgO International's intention is to provide to the public an alternate competitive service on the above-mentioned routes.

Legislative and Policy Considerations

The proposal of capacity sought is in accordance with section 8 and 9 of the Policy Statement, being a benefit to the public by allowing access to an alternate Australian carrier. In addition, AERgO International is well placed to obtain the necessary licences within the timeframe to meet the requirements to operate the services sort.
