# **RE RENEWAL OF DETERMINATIONS**

Thank you for your letter dated 1 June 2021 regarding the renewal of capacity determinations due in the next 12 months for Qantas Airways Limited and its wholly owned subsidiary Jetstar Airways Pty Limited.

# Indonesia Route – Determination [2017] IASC 112

• Qantas seeks renewal of Determination [2017] IASC 112 which allocates 100 seats per week in each direction of passenger capacity on the Indonesia route for a period of five years, expiring on 26 June 2022. Qantas requests all existing conditions be retained.

## Korea Route – Determination [2016] IASC 109

• Qantas seeks renewal of Determination [2016] IASC 109 which allocates 500 seats per week in each direction of passenger capacity on the Korea route for a period of five years, expiring on 26 June 2022. Qantas requests all existing conditions be retained.

## Papua New Guinea Route – Determination [2016] IASC 110

• Qantas seeks renewal of Determination [2016] IASC 110 which allocates 1,000 seats per week in each direction of passenger capacity on the Papua New Guinea route for a period of five years, expiring on 30 June 2022. Qantas requests all existing conditions be retained.

## Thailand Route – Determination [2017] IASC 108

• Qantas seeks renewal of Determination [2017] IASC 108 which allocates 35.6 B747 equivalent units and 26 third country code share frequencies of passenger capacity per week on the Thailand route for a period of five years, expiring on 1 July 2022. Qantas requests all existing conditions be retained.
